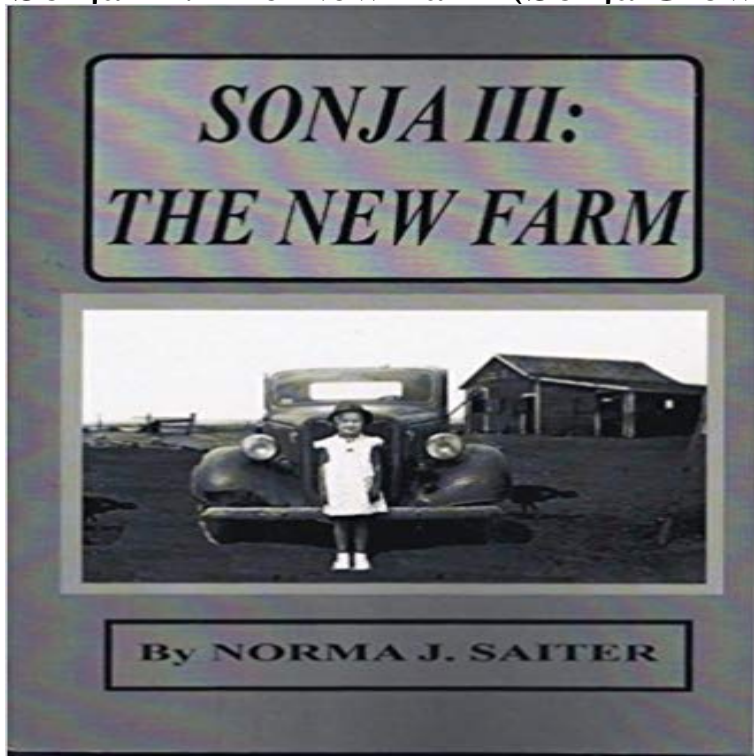


## Sonja III: The New Farm (Sonja Growing Up On The Prairie Book 3)



Sonja III: The New Farm is set on the plains of northeastern Colorado on the farm Sonja's Swedish grandparents homesteaded.

Seven year old Sonja lives there with her parents and grandparents. It is 1939. The farm has no electricity or running water and has an outdoor privy. Sonja explores the prairie. She catches horned toads, picks wild flowers, collects pretty rocks, and laughs when calves scamper about.

In this third book in the Sonja series, Sonja enters second grade in a one-room school on the Colorado plains. She is one of five students and very soon develops a close relationship with her teacher, Mrs. Wanker.

The days are sometimes marred by a boy and girl who argue with each other and tease Sonja. Marching around the room to a tune Mrs. Wanker plays on the piano is one of her favorite things to do. Sonja experiences butchering day and has a lesson on the anatomy of a pig. She learns how to clean intestines before they're stuffed with sausage. She groans when she sees blood added to meat to make blood sausage. She can't imagine that Grandpa will eat the pig's feet. She says the scrambled eggs that Grandma fixed for breakfast are delicious until she learns the eggs are mixed with the pig's brains. Readers will experience a blizzard as Sonja watches snow swirl and race across the prairie as it plasters the sides of buildings and piles up in drifts. She feels sorry for the cows and is afraid the barn isn't warm enough. Sonja is disappointed when the school program is canceled because of the storm. She helped decorate the classroom with chains made from construction paper and had learned her part in the play. All is well until Grandpa and Daddy have an argument and Daddy and Mama decide to leave the homestead and find a place of their own. Sonja feels her world crumble. Things look up when she is allowed to stay with Grandpa and Grandma during the week so she can stay at Pleasant Prairie

School. She has the best of all worlds with week days with Grandpa and Grandma and weekends with her parents. Sonja meets friends when neighbors throw a surprise housewarming party, and she decides it is good that Daddy and Mama decided to move. She likes going to Sunday School at the little country church but wishes the minister wouldnt talk so long. Life gets even better when Daddy buys a horse to ride and gets Brownie, a loveable dog. Sonja and her classmates scamper though the gullies at Pawnee Buttes on the last day of school picnic. They steer clear of the rattle snake coiled on the path they took around the base of the butte. At the end of the day she hugs her teacher good-bye and gets ready for summer on the new farm.
