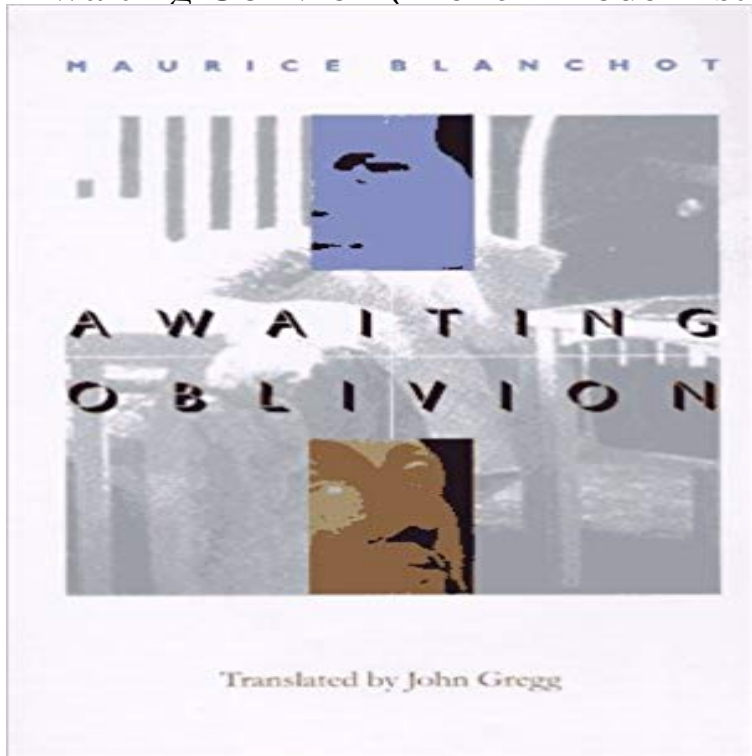


Awaiting Oblivion (French Modernist Library)
