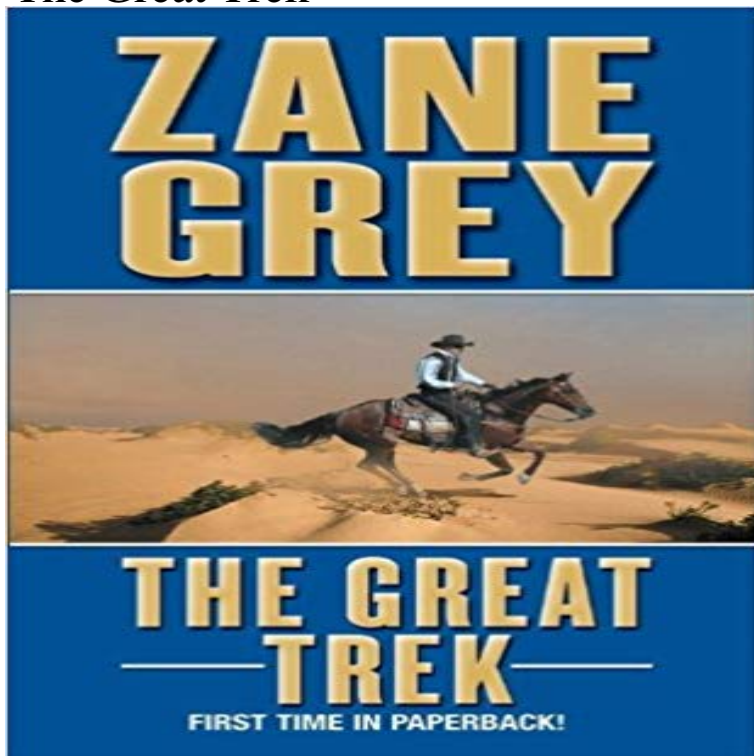


The Great Trek
