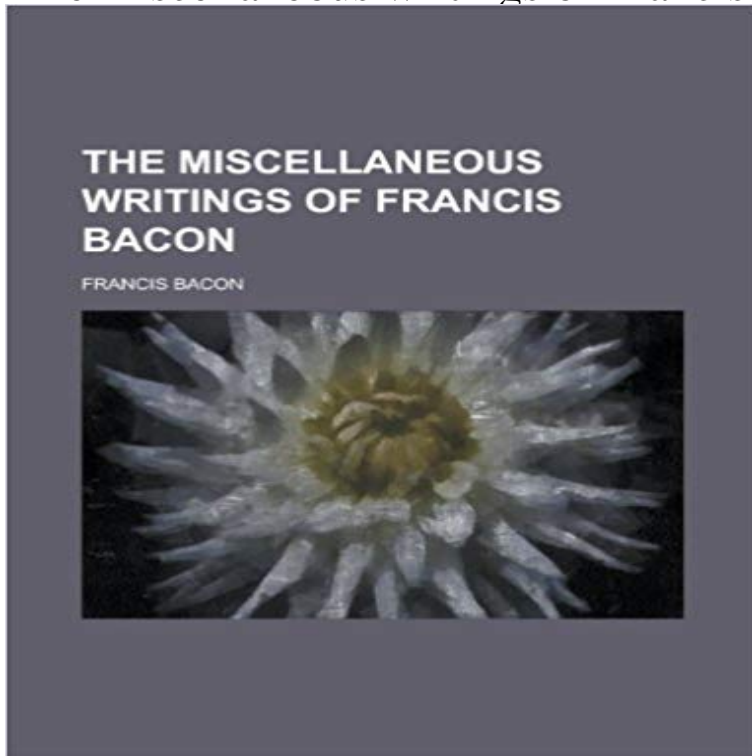


The miscellaneous writings of Francis Bacon
