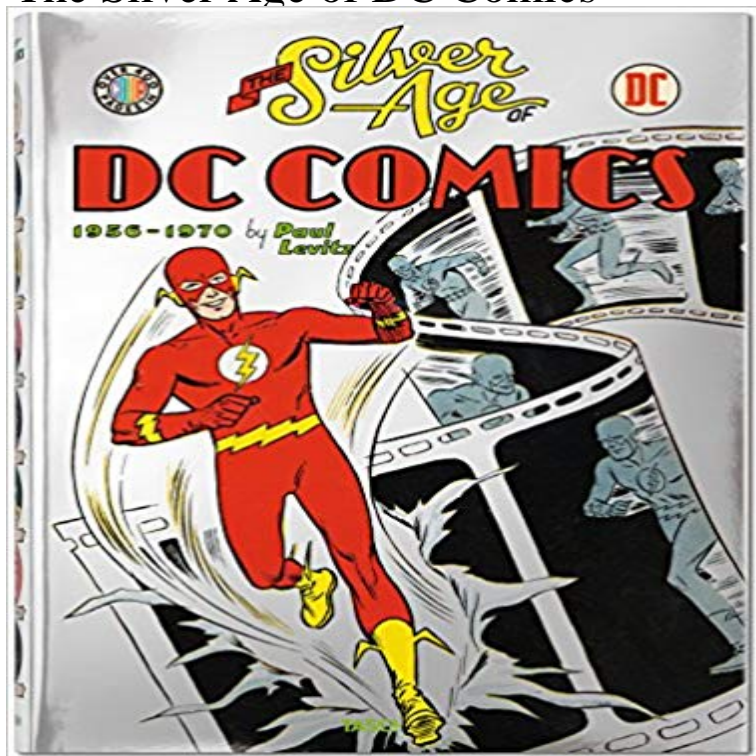


The Silver Age of DC Comics
